SPECIAL GUEST ~ DONNA CAPONI



Donna Caponi was born in Detroit, Michigan, and started playing golf at the age of 5. Being taught golf by her father, Harry, she won the Los Angeles Junior title in 1956, and tied for 21st as an amateur at the 1964 Hillside House Ladies' Open on the LPGA Tour.

She joined the LPGA Tour in 1965 and won her first tournament in 1969 at the U.S. Women's Open. She would repeat as champion in 1970 and would go on to win a total of 24 events on the LPGA Tour, including four major championships.

She finished in the top ten on the money list ten times between 1968 and 1981, including second-place finishes in 1976 and 1980. In 1981 she was named Female Player of the Year by Golf Writers Association of America.

In 1988 she retired from full-time competition, and she was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2001. In 2009, she was the recipient of the PGA First Lady of Golf Award.

THE FACES OF NEUROFIBROMATOSIS



The children pictured above have neurofibromatosis (NF), a genetic tumor disorder that affects more people than cystic fibrosis and muscular dystrophy combined! As is typical of NF, they are all affected differently. These kids have symptoms that range from mild learning disabilities to debilitating tumors of the brain and spinal cord, tumors in the airway, external tumors, paralysis, hearing loss and optic gliomas. Their medical histories could fill volumes, yet they all try to pursue a "normal" existence in spite of frightening obstacles.

There is no cure and there is no treatment for NF except surgery to remove tumors which frequently grow back. NF is very unpredictable and no one knows how NF will affect these young children as they grow older. But, NF research offers hope.

Since its inception thirty-two years ago, this tournament has raised millions of dollars to support peer reviewed research. Today, NF research is on the forefront of the biomedical revolution. Scientists now realize that NF research will also benefit individuals who don't have NF but are affected by cancer, brain tumors, and learning disabilities.
